

## **Front Line Intelligence: a three day conference and work-shop**

### **Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of this course, participants will have a full understanding and acquired applied skills to monitor operations, recognize field threats, and use a full spectrum of intelligence tools available to collect, analyze, interpret and report sensitive information internally and to share with adjoining jurisdictions, critical infrastructure managers, and other key private industry partners.

### **Course Description**

Resulting from high demand requests from the field, this course was specifically developed to provide learners with a comprehensive understanding of the concepts, multiple processes and disciplines associated with using intelligence as an additional tool to best support a spectrum of field operational responsibilities and security programs. The course blends intelligence theories with applications addressing actual field operations. Students will learn best surveillance methods, an overview of behavioral analysis, and how to effectively use multiple open source and restricted data collection and dissemination resources. A strong evaluation and analysis learning component is integrated in the program with security applications to help identify criminal and other targeted activity. Comprehensive “hands on” field training exercises close out the three day session with student evaluations and debriefings. Included with the training materials, a comprehensive overview of intelligence resources and reference tools are also provided.
